## Record a Sighting

### Long Necked turtle

- Very long neck - as long as the shell
- Often flattened head



### Species

Broad Shelled Turtle (*Chelodina expansa*)

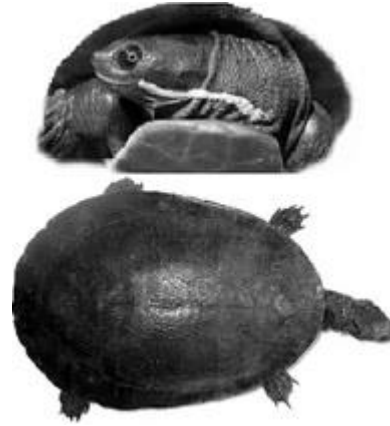


Eastern Snake-necked Turtle (*Chelodina longicollis*)



### Short Necked turtle

- Short and thick neck
- Often a cream, yellow or red colouration around the eyes or neck and mouth



### Species

Short Neck Turtle (*Emydura macquarii*).
